(am besten auf unterschiedlich farbigem Papier)

### So wird gespielt:

Die Karten mit den Satzanfängen werden gemischt, ebenso die Karten mit den Satzenden. Dann werden beide Stapel verdeckt auf den Tisch gelegt. Spieler A zieht die oberste Karte von den Satzanfängen. Spieler B zieht die oberste Karte von den Satzenden. Nun lesen beide den so entstandenen Satz vor. Anschließend zieht Spieler B einen Satzanfang und Spieler A ein Satzende.

Hier einige Beispielkarten. Wie man sieht, ergeben sich allerhand lustige Kombinationsmöglichkeiten!

### So wird gespielt:

Es wird abwechselnd gewürfelt. Wer an der Reihe ist, geht entweder zu der Spalte oder zu der Zeile, die zu seiner Wurfzahl passt und wählt darin ein Aufgabenfeld aus, das er lösen möchte.

### Beispiel:

Zu „Na klar!“ ab 5. Klasse Hauptschule:

Spieler A würfelt eine „2“. Er wählt in Zeile 2 (bei „Das Gegenteil“) das erste Aufgabenfeld. Nun nennt er zu den dort angegebenen Adjektiven „good“, „late“ und „hard“ die Gegenteile. Hat er die Aufgabe korrekt gelöst, legt er eines seiner Plättchen dort ab. Die Lösung kann mithilfe der Lösungsliste kontrolliert werden.

Stimmt die Lösung des Spielers nicht, darf er auch kein Plättchen ablegen.

Danach ist Spieler B an der Reihe.

Auf diese Weise versucht jeder Spieler, im Laufe des Spieles 4 eigene Plättchen in eine Reihe zu legen – und zwar so, dass keine gegnerischen Plättchen oder freien Felder diese Reihe unterbrechen. Die Reihe kann senkrecht, waagrecht oder diagonal gesetzt werden – wie beim Spiel „Vier gewinnt“.

Hat er die Aufgabe korrekt gelöst, legt er eines seiner Plättchen dort ab.

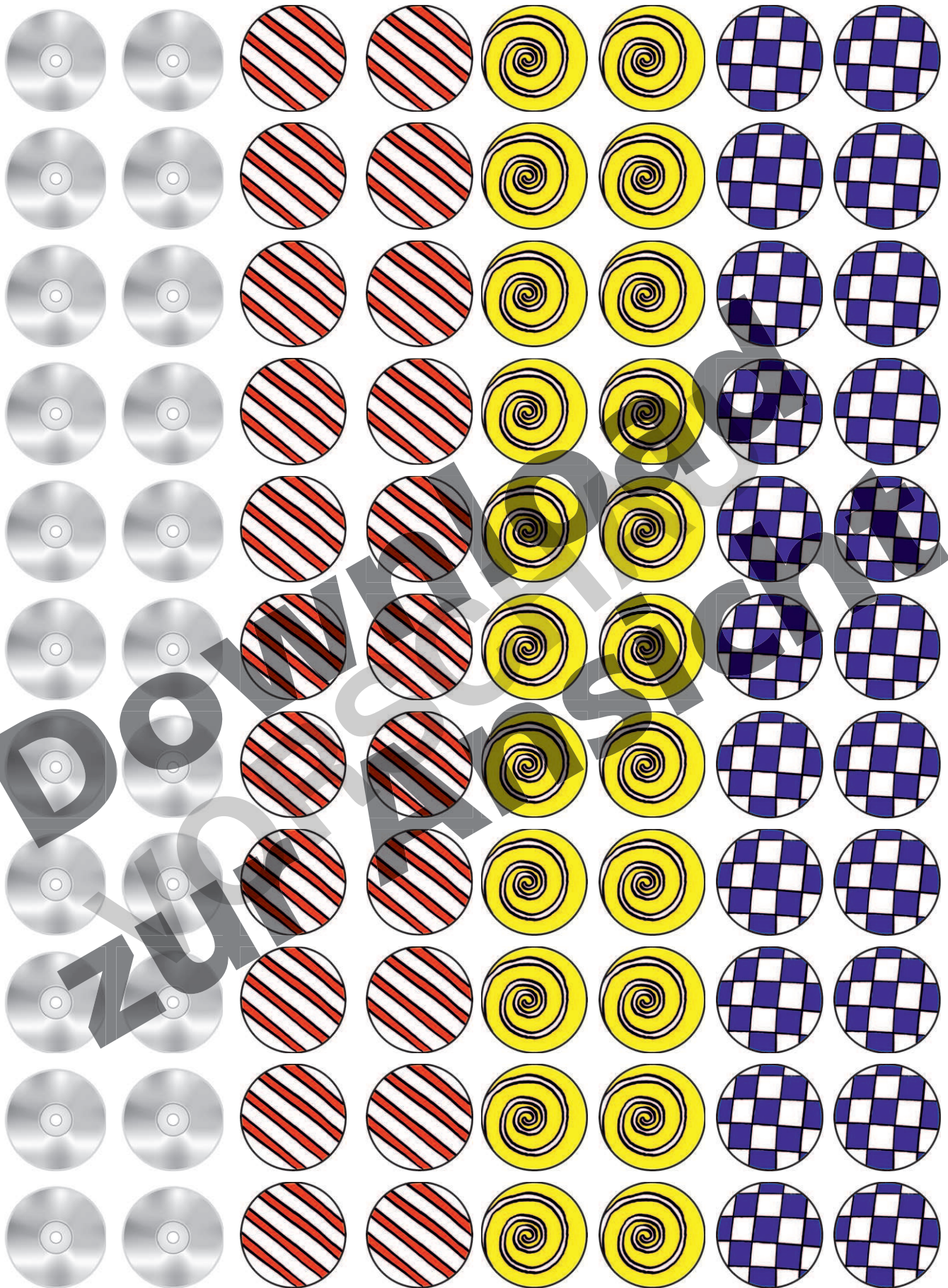
