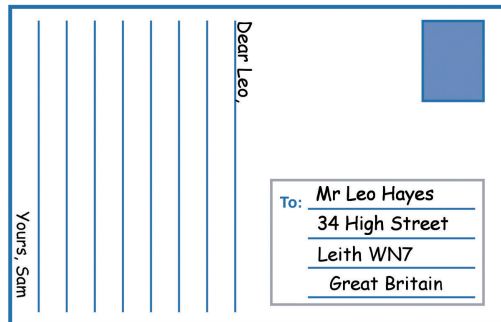

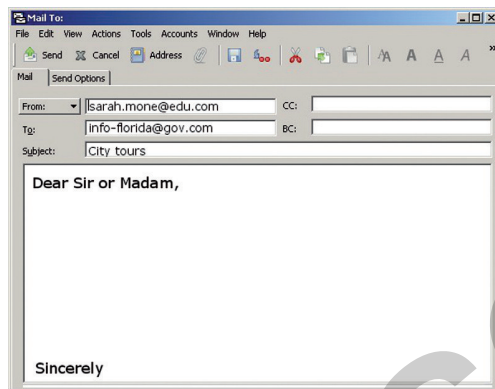
Writing reports

1. Writing a postcard



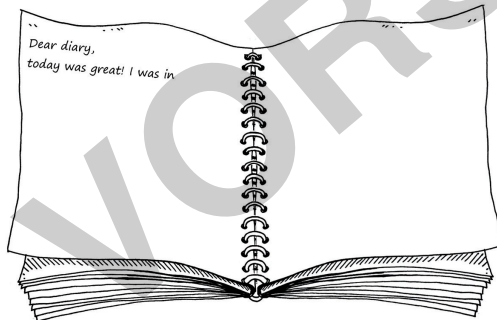
- ✓ short sentences

2. Writing an email



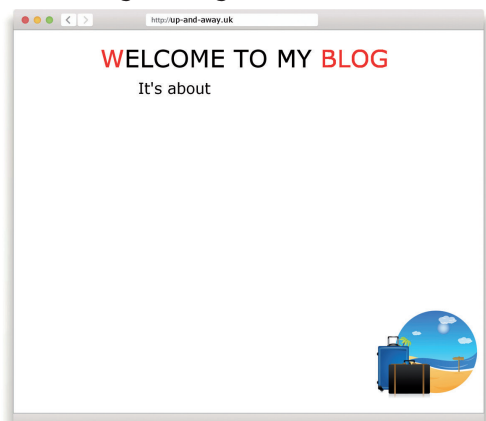
- ✓ be polite
- ✓ introduce yourself and write about your problem
- ✓ ask questions
- ✓ formal style (I am, I do not ...)

3. Writing a diary entry



- ✓ informal style
- ✓ topics: your personal experiences, dreams, wishes, thoughts

4. Writing a blog



- ✓ informal style
- ✓ inform others about what you think, what you have seen or what you did

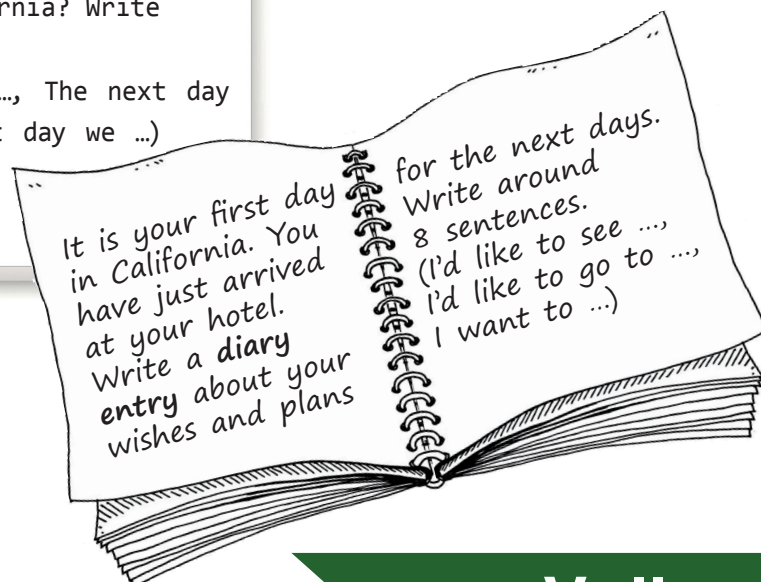
