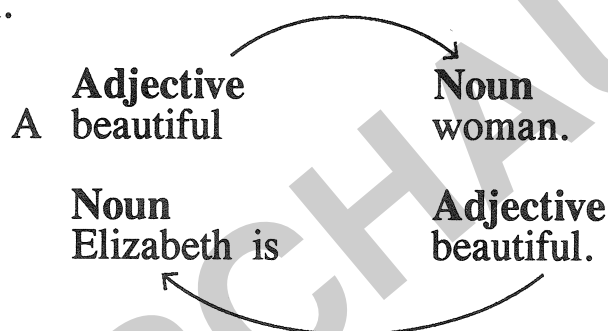
4 Adjectives and Adverbs of Manner

4.1 Der Unterschied zwischen Adjectives und Adverbs



Elizabeth Di Marino is a beautiful woman.

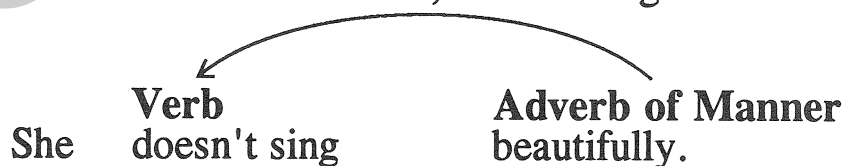
Das Wort *beautiful* ist ein **Adjective** (Adjektiv/Eigenschaftswort) und beschreibt Elizabeth.



Adjectives beschreiben Nouns.

Unfortunately she doesn't sing beautifully.

Das Wort *beautifully* ist ein **Adverb of Manner** (Adverb der Art und Weise) und beschreibt die Art und Weise, wie sie singt.



Adverbs of Manner beschreiben Verbs.

Im Gegensatz zum Deutschen unterscheiden sich im Englischen Adjectives und Adverbs of Manner in ihren Formen:

Die Frau ist schön.

Sie singt schön.

The woman is beautiful.

Sie sings beautifully.
