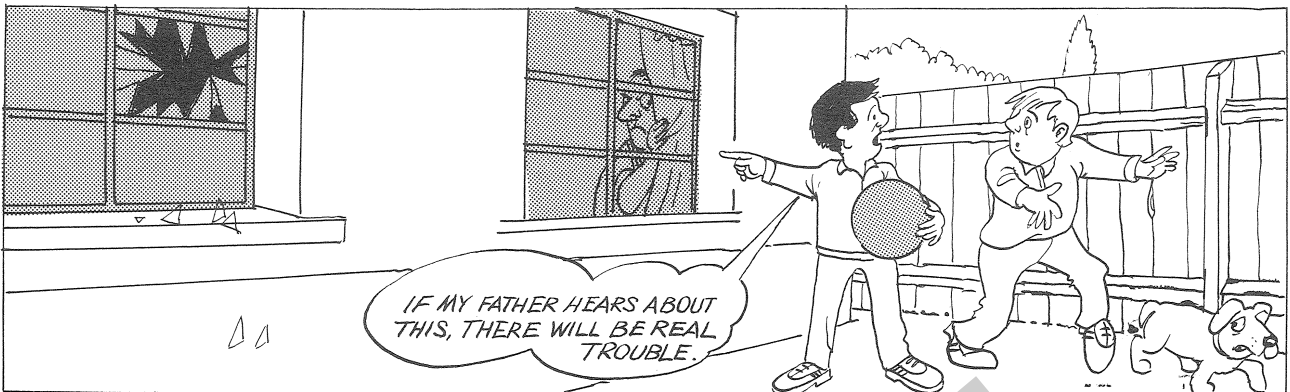


### 3 If-clauses

#### 3.1 If-clause - Present Tense, Main Clause - Future with "shall/will"



Dieser Junge überlegt sich: "Was wird passieren, wenn mein Vater davon hört?" Es wird sicherlich Krach geben.

Willst du Vermutungen anstellen, verwendest du einen If-clause (Bedingungssatz). Er steht im Present Tense. Der Main Clause (Hauptsatz) steht im Future mit "shall/will".

<b>Möglichkeit/Bedingung</b>	▶ <b>Folge, wenn Bedingung erfüllt</b>
<b>If-clause mit Present Tense</b>	▶ <b>Main Clause mit Future mit "shall/will"</b>
<b>If my father hears about this</b>	▶ <b>there will be real trouble.</b>
<b>Wenn mein Vater davon erfährt,</b>	<b>wird es einen bösen Krach geben.</b>

**Merke:**

<b>If-clause</b>	- <b>Present Tense (kein "will"!)</b>
<b>Main clause</b>	- <b>will-Future: I shall/will, we shall/will ; he, she, it, you, they will, Kurzform ... 'll für alle</b>

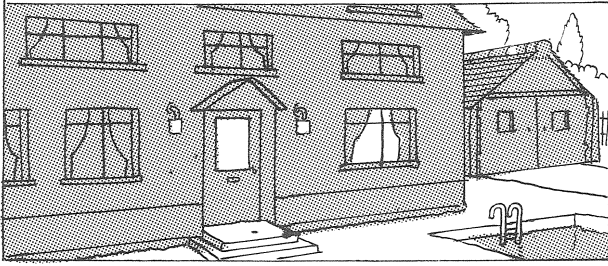
