

Chapter 1

The costume shop


'You need black boots,' he says to Dean. He gets them. Then he opens the door to a small room. 'You can change in here.' He puts the costume in the room and goes.

She creeps inside.


Near the door, there are coats on a rack. Abbie hides behind the coats and looks into the room. She sees *two* musketeers!
