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ABOUT THE BOOK

This book gives young English learners the opportunity to revise important basic vocabulary typically taught at primary school in grades three and four.

Each of the twelve rhymes deals with one of the topics commonly introduced in this phase of English learning, such as „colours“, „school things“, „body parts“ or „family“. The vocabulary is accompanied by illustrations that enable young learners to grasp the meaning of words without switching to the German translation.

For each rhyme two pages of corresponding exercises are provided to increase the learning effect.

Colour Rhyme



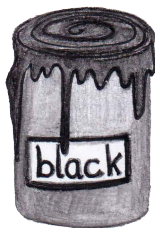
If you were a painter,

happiness bright.

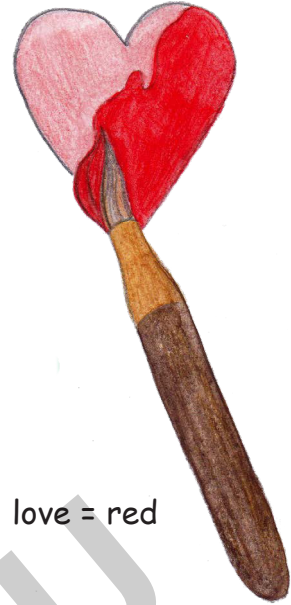
