

## Word pyramid



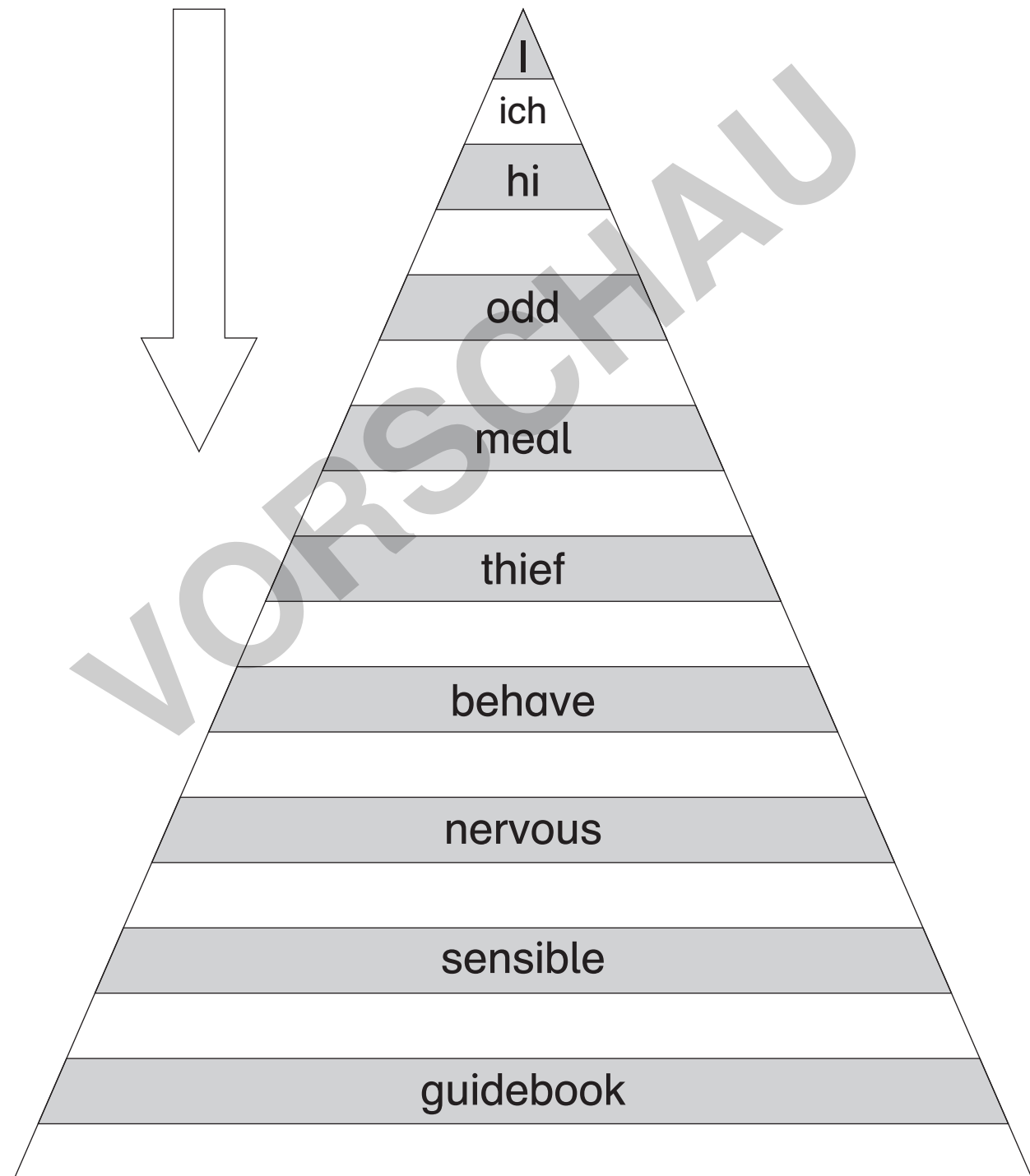
### Task

The first one is done for you.

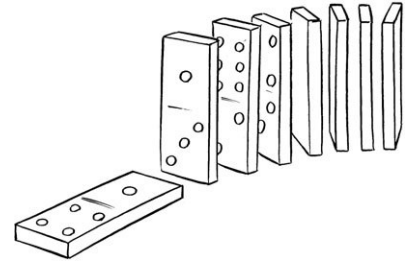


## A perfect dialogue
