

British food

Emma is on holiday in England. Her aunt Stacey tells her all about typical (*typisch*) British food.



To get to know what Emma learns about British food, start at number 1.

- ① This is what British people eat for breakfast: small sausages. We eat them with baked beans (*weiße Bohnen mit Tomatensoße*). Can you find them?
- ② The English word for your German 'Chips' is crisps. This is not fish 'n' chips.
- ③ This is shortbread. Some say it's only a biscuit (*Keks*), but I think it's more than that. Another food we like is black pudding.
- ④ Chicken Tikka Masala is an Indian dish (*Speise*). Indian culture and food are very popular in England. We love this dish.
- ⑤ That's scrambled eggs, correct. They're great! The most famous thing we eat for lunch is fish 'n' chips.
- ⑥ We might eat toast on Sundays, but I said Sunday roast, not toast.
- ⑦ These are beans as well, but they're jellybeans. They're sweets. We don't eat them for breakfast.
- ⑧ This is a chocolate egg. Very good for Easter (*Ostern*), but not typically British.
- ⑨ This is tea, but it's not black tea. Other kinds of tea are not very familiar (*bekannt*) here.
- ⑩ Sunday roast is a very traditional meal. It's meat (*Fleisch*) and vegetables (*Gemüse*). Another tradition is our black tea for teatime.
- ⑪ Yes, this is black pudding. But it is not sweet, like your German pudding: it's a kind of sausage. The last meal you will get to know is Chicken Tikka Masala.
- ⑫ Well done, these are baked beans. We love them. Some people also eat scrambled eggs. Do you know what that is?
- ⑬ This looks like a typical German bread. It's not shortbread.
- ⑭ British people love black tea. We drink it with milk, and we eat shortbread with it. Can you see the shortbread?

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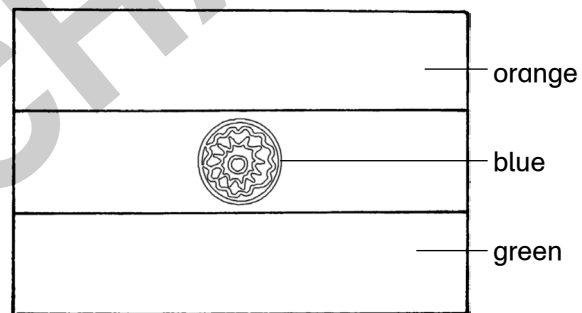
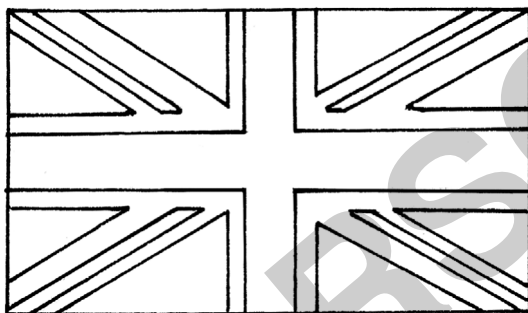
Emma is visiting her family in England for the holidays. Her aunt Stacey tells her all about rugby, the Royal Family and, of course, British food.

- ⑧ This is a chocolate egg. Very good for Easter (*Ostern*), but not typically British.
- ⑨ This is tea, but it's not black tea. Other kinds of tea are not very familiar (*bekannt*) here.
- ⑩ Our Sunday roast is a very traditional meal, served on Sundays, of course. It's roast meat (*Braten*), roast potatoes (*Bratkartoffeln*) and other vegetables (*Gemüse*). It's a must have! Another tradition is our black tea for teatime.

If you want to know aunt Stacey's favourite meat for Sunday roast, read this word backwards: YEKRUT.

- ⑪ Yes, this lovely dish is our black pudding. It is not sweet, and it is not a dessert. It's actually a kind of sausage. Now we get to the last meal. It's Chicken Tikka Masala.
