Ireland

Ireland is split (*geteilt*) into Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. Northern Ireland is a part of the United Kingdom. The Republic of Ireland is independent (*unabhängig*).

To learn more about the Republic of Ireland, start reading at number 1.

- The Republic of Ireland is a country in Western Europe. It is also an island. It borders on (angrenzen an) Northern Ireland, but it's not part of the United Kingdom. Can you find its flag? It's green, white and orange.
- 2 The River Shannon is the longest river in Ireland. It flows (*flieβen*) all the way from Dowra to a place near Limerick. Limerick is a big city in Ireland. But the biggest city is Dublin.
- 3 The Irish name of the country is not that easy to pronounce (*aussprechen*). The name of the biggest mountain in Ireland Carrauntoohil is also very difficult.
- (4) These words are not Irish, but English.
- (5) This is a guitar. It is sometimes used in Irish music, but it's not typically Irish.
- 6 This is an Irish policeman. The Irish call the police 'Garda'. One last fact about Ireland has something to do with the church.
- (7) This flag is green, white and red. It's the flag of Italy, not Ireland.
- 8 The flag of Ireland is green, white and orange. You can find it all over Ireland. The Irish love their flag, and they also love their second official language (*Amtssprache*), which is Irish.
- (9) Erie is a city in the USA. It has nothing to do with Ireland.
- Most people in Ireland are Christian (*Christen*). The Catholic Church administers (*verwalten*) many schools. But everybody is free to choose their religion.
- There are some mountains in Ireland. The highest mountain is the Carrauntoohil: it's highest point is 1 038 metres. The longest river in Ireland is 370 kilometres long.







Ireland

The Republic of Ireland is an island state (*Inselstaat*) in Western Europe. It borders on (*angrenzen an*) Northern Ireland. The Republic of Ireland is not part of the United Kingdom. Can you find its flag?





- 2 The River Shannon is the longest river in Ireland. It flows (*fließen*) all the way from Dowra to a place near Limerick. Eventually (*letztendlich*) it flows into the Atlantic Ocean. Limerick is a big city in Ireland which is worth visiting (*sehenswert*). But the biggest city is Dublin.
- The Irish name of the country is not that easy to pronounce (*aussprechen*) because the Irish language has different sounds (*Laute*) from what we know. Another example of a word which is difficult to pronounce is the biggest mountain in Ireland Carrauntoohil.
- (4) These words are not Irish, but English.
- (5) This is a guitar. It is also sometimes used in Irish music, but it's not typically Irish.
- This is an Irish policeman. The Irish call the police 'Garda'. This is what you can read on their uniforms. 'Garda' is another Irish word. We're almost done: here comes one last fact about Ireland. It has something to do with the church.
- (7) This flag is green, white and red. It's the flag of Italy, not Ireland.
- The flag of Ireland is green, white and orange. You can find it all over Ireland because the Irish are proud of (*stolz auf*) their flag. They're also very proud of their second official language (*Amtssprache*), which is Irish.
