




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A paper chase in Hallford

My reading trail:



- 16 This is the third crossroad. They won't find a hint here. The girls have to go to the second crossroad. They crossed it already!
- This isn't a park, this is a car park. There are many parking cars, but you won't find a pond in a car park.
- At the crossroad the girls stop and look everywhere for the next hint. After a few moments one of Maggie's guests finds the hint hidden in a small bush. It reads: "Super! Now turn right and follow Woodhouse Way northwards. You will find the next hint at the second crossroad."
- In the park the girls head for the shore of the pond. They look into the water. What is that? There is a tiny plastic card under a stone. Maggie sticks her hand into the water and gets it. She reads it out loud: "You are really good! You even found this small and well-hidden card in the pond. Your treasure gets closer and closer. Go back onto Old Street and follow it southwards until you get to London Road. Follow London Road until its end."



- The girls know their trees very well. This is a beech tree. But it's not the correct one. The girls turned left, but the letter said they have to go eastwards.
- After four minutes the girls reach the second crossroad. This time the letter is fixed to a rubbish bin. Maggie opens it and reads: "Very well done, girls. But your treasure chest is not here. There is still a long way for you to go. Can you see the big beech tree on the right, if you follow Bank Way East? That's where you have to go!"
