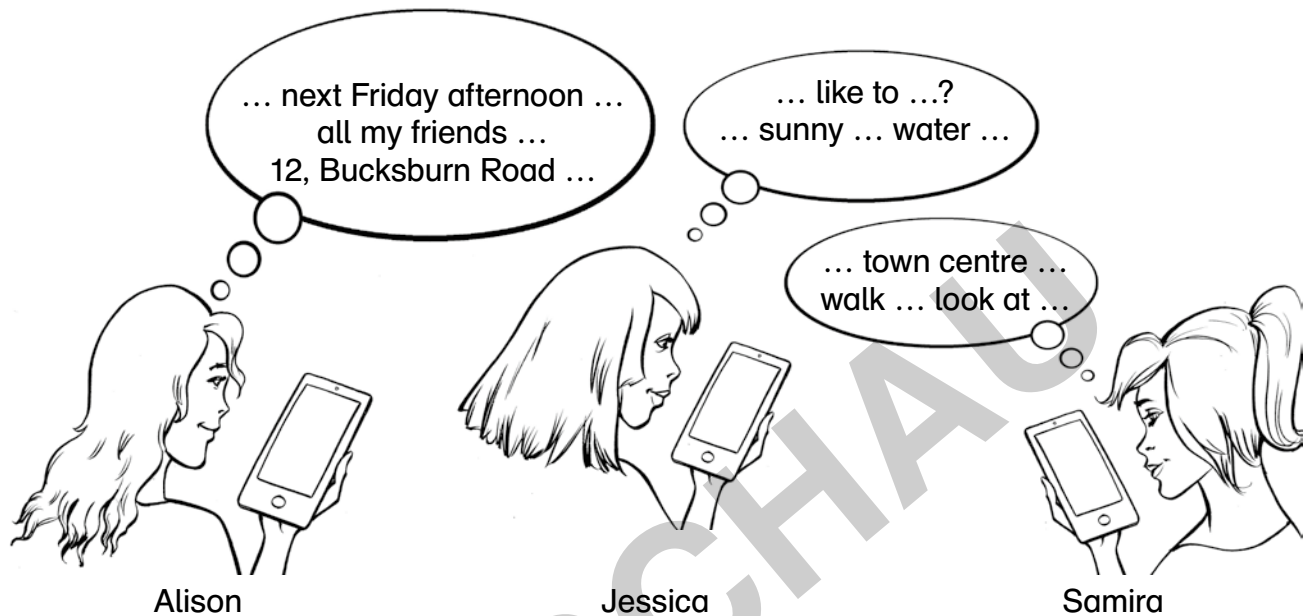




Mysterious messages

What to do:

3. Arrange the cards within each group: Which card is the first reaction to the message, which is the second, and so on.
4. Glue (*kleben*) the cards on to the poster and link them with words such as "and", "but" and "because" where possible. Then answer the question and write the answer on the poster.

I like going shopping so much!

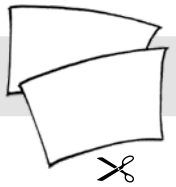
I love looking at all those nice things in the shop windows.

I mustn't eat too much cake – Mum doesn't like that.

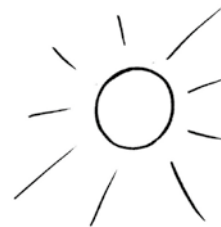
I hope David can't come – I don't like him!
