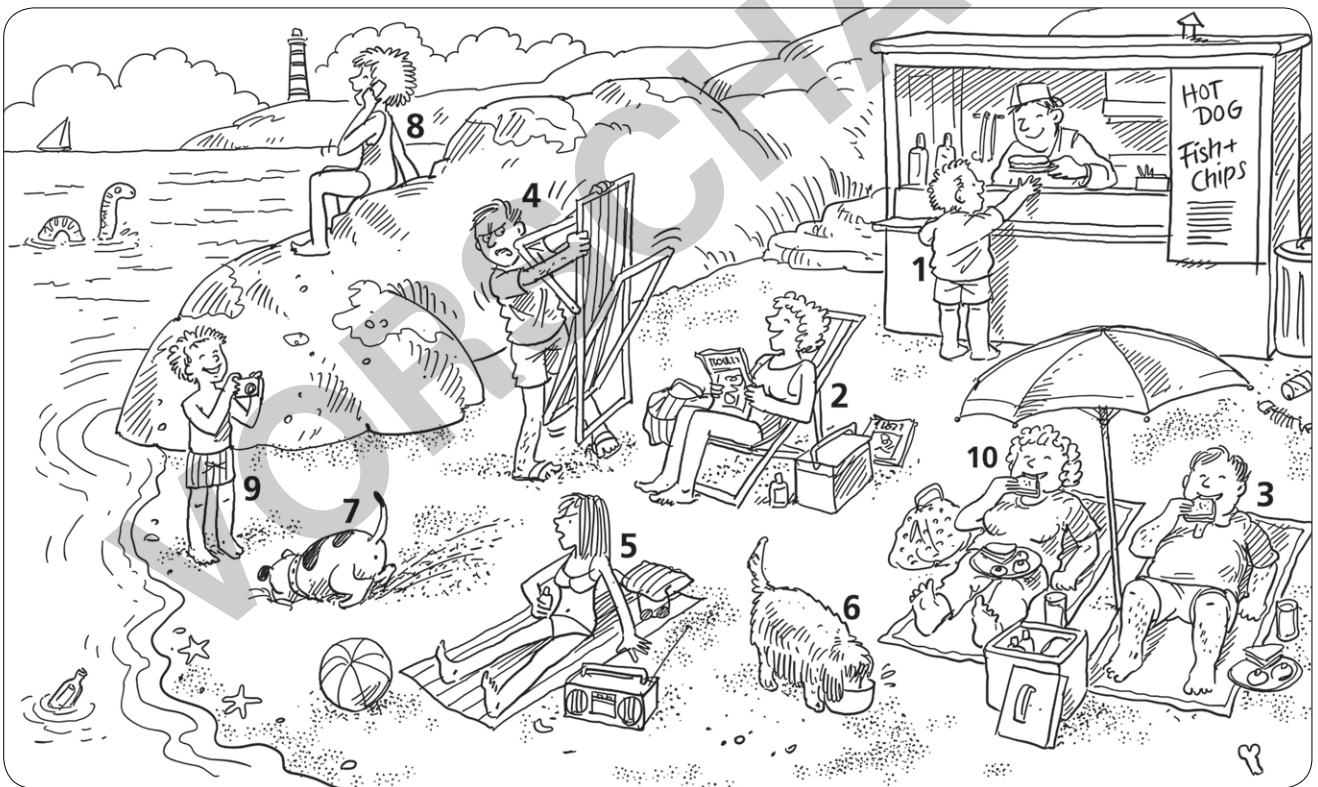
At the beach

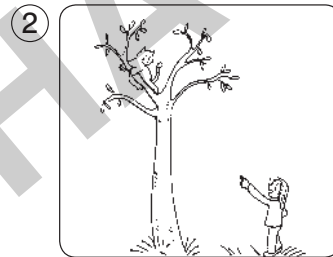

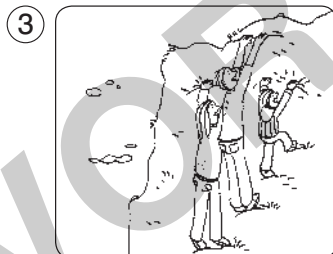
The illustrations below show four emergency situations. Choose one of them and complete the emergency call. Work with a partner and act out your emergency calls.



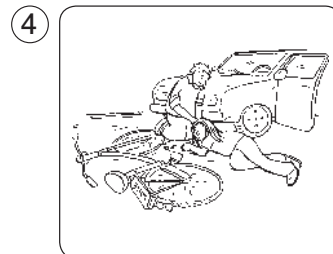
