There are many local government offices in the town hall.

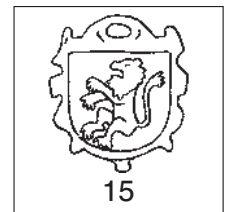
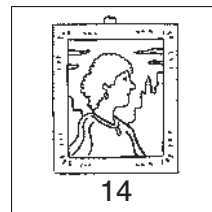
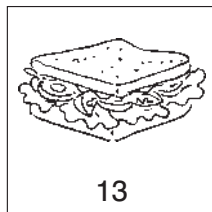
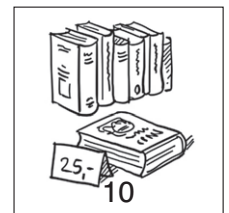
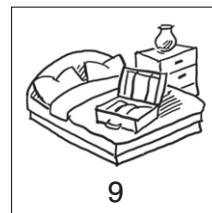
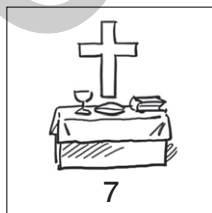
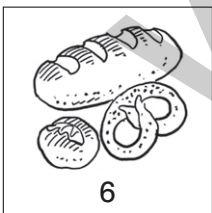
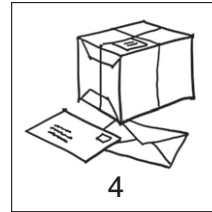
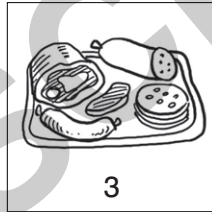
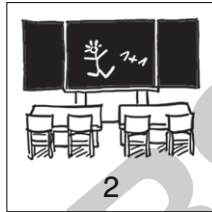
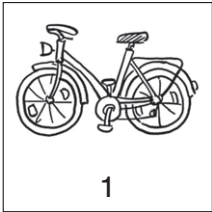
A bike shop sells bikes and often repairs them, too.

A butcher's shop sells meat: steaks, sausages and meat pies.

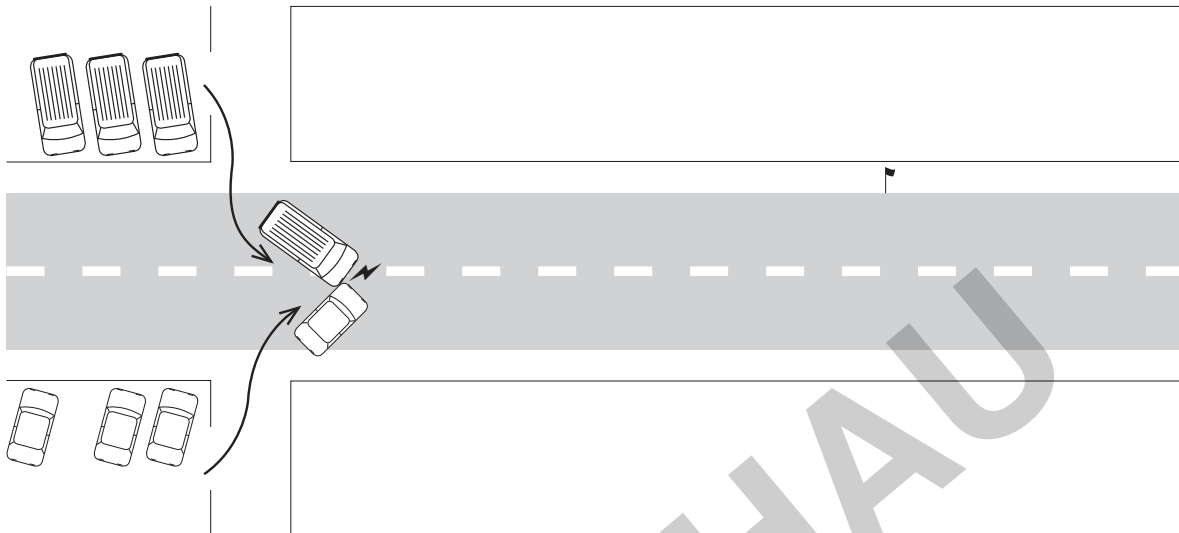
Visitors to the town can rent a room at a hotel.

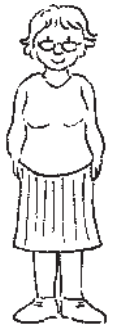

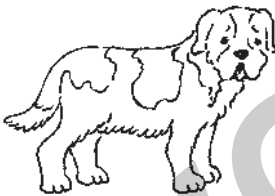
