Vorwort

Liebe Kolleginnen, liebe Kollegen,

Fußball bietet sich als ein Thema (auch) für den Unterricht im Fach Englisch an. Das Thema motiviert Schülerinnen und Schüler; die beliebte und spannende Sportart gewinnt weltweit immer mehr Fans und Spieler beider Geschlechter. Frauenfußball wird heute nicht mehr belächelt, sondern wird auch in Deutschland immer beliebter. Im Englischunterricht ist der populäre Sport auch relevant dadurch, dass England das Mutterland des modernen Fußballsports ist. Viele Briten sind fußballinteressiert, wenn nicht sogar fußballbegeistert. Zudem ist Fußball mit Abstand die beliebteste Sportart in Deutschland und Großbritannien – wie auch in vielen weiteren Ländern.

Vor diesem Hintergrund entstand der vorliegende Band, der für den Englischunterricht in der Sekundarstufe I bestimmt ist. Dieser Band ging vor allem hervor aus meiner langjährigen Arbeit als Lehrer mit lern-, und leistungsschwächeren Schülerinnen und Schülern. Er befasst sich hauptsächlich mit dem Fußball in Großbritannien und Deutschland. Das Thema wird in unterschiedlichen Aufgabenformaten behandelt. Dabei sind die Texte im Band (relativ) kurz gehalten, der Satzbau ist in der Regel einfach und leicht verständlich, um auch lern- und leistungsschwächere Schüler zu erreichen, sowie ihnen Lernerfolge zu ermöglichen.

Der präsentierte Band vermittelt Kenntnisse zum Fußballsport und hat das Ziel, allgemein die englischen Sprachkenntnisse der Heranwachsenden zu erweitern sowie deren Ausdrucksvermögen in der Fremdsprache zu verbessern. Den vorliegenden Arbeitsmaterialien lassen sich nach Belieben weitere Übungen hinzufügen. Leistungstärkere Schüler(innen) können zur Erstellung weiterer Materialien beitragen und/oder Internetrecherche betreiben.

Der Kohl-Verlag und ich sind konstruktiver Kritik und Anregungen zum Werk gegenüber aufgeschlossen. Ansonsten wünschen wir Ihnen mit dem vorliegenden Band und dem begeisternden Thema viel Erfolg und gelungene Unterrichtsstunden.

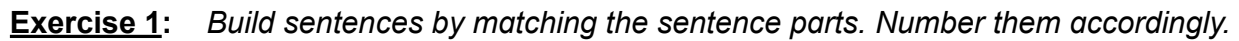

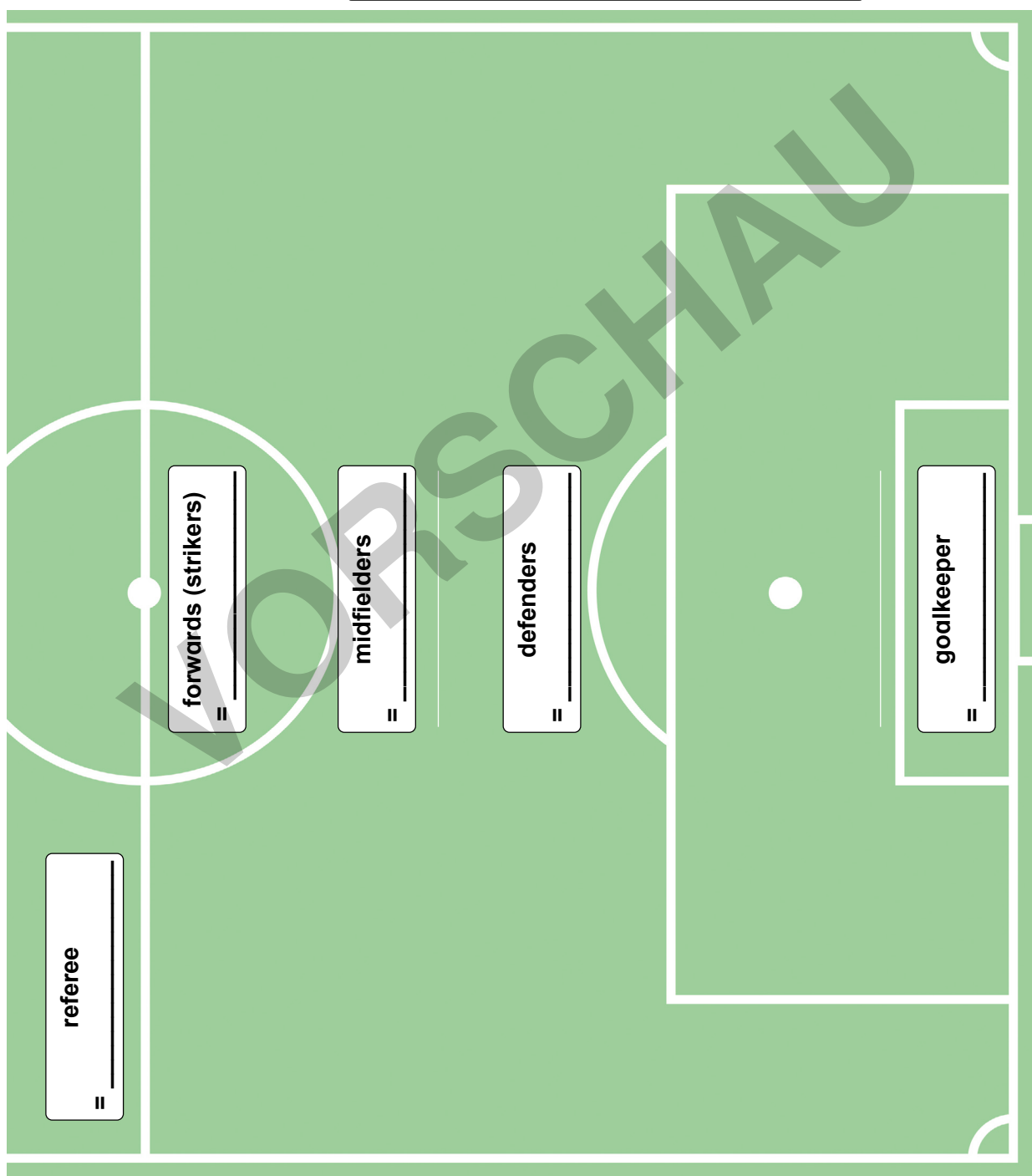

In 2014, the Football World Cup was held in Brazil. The teams of Germany and Argentina qualified for the World Cup final. This match took place in Rio de Janeiro at the famous Maracana Stadium.

It happened on 13th July 2014. Neither Germany nor Argentina

succeeded in scoring a goal within 90 minutes. Therefore, the match went into extra time (30 minutes). During the extra time it seemed that the match remained goalless and a penalty shoot-out would follow. But in the 113th minute of play, the German player Schürrle ran past two defenders on the left and then he crossed into the penalty area.



The German player Mario Götze immediately controlled the ball on his chest and volleyed it with his left foot into the Argentinian goal. This fantastic hit was the only goal in this encounter. The German team won the football match against Argentina 1-0 and became World Champion for the fourth time.

All over the world more and more women and girls like football. Many of them are joining football clubs. For example, there is a 30% increase in registered football teams with women.

The first English female (= women) football club was founded in 1894. But in 1902 the English Football Association banned women from football. With World War I, when men were sent to war, women's role in society changed. Women's football increased again. However, in 1921, the English Football Association said that women were not allowed to play football on pitches of the FA. Football for women was not generally forbidden but all grounds were related to the FA, so women were banned once again.

Since 1971, women in England have been allowed to play football on FA pitches again.

In Germany the first football club for women was founded in 1930. However, shortly after, this women's activity was not allowed anymore. The German football association (DFB) officially banned women's and girl's football in 1955. The DFB declared that "this sport is fundamentally foreign to the nature of women". But German women didn't give up and played about 150 unofficial matches until 1970, when the DFB allowed women's football again. The German female football championships have been held since 1974. Germany's primary football competition - the Bundesliga - for women was introduced in 1990. Germany's female national team has been quite successful so far: They have won the European and World Championships several times.
