(Mark kam an nachdem wir gegangen waren.)

Mark **arrived** after we **had left** (had gone).

Before I ... to Spain, I ... never ... paella.
(Bevor ich nach Spanien ging, hatte ich nie Paella gegessen.)

Before I went to Spain, I **had** never eaten paella.



After I ... my bed I ... my room.
(Nachdem ich mein Bett gemacht hatte, brachte ich mein Zimmer in Ordnung.)

After I **had made** my bed I **tidied** my room

Grandma and I ... the meal that I ...
(Oma und ich aßen das Essen, das ich gekocht hatte.)

Grandma and I **ate** the meal that I **had cooked**.

write - **wrote** - **written**

choose - ... - ...
(auswählen - wählte - gewählt)

choose - **chose** - **chosen**

drink - ... - ...
(trinken - trank - getrunken)



drink - **drank** - **drunk**

drive - ... - ...
(fahren - fuhr - gefahren)

drive - **drove** - **driven**

ride - ... - ...
(reiten - ritt - geritten)

ride - **rode** - **ridden**

see - ... - ...
(sehen - sah - gesehen)

see - **saw** - **seen**

Mum ... a car for 20 years.
(Mum fährt seit 20 Jahren Auto.)
* Mit present perfect Übersetzen.

Mum **has driven** a car for 20 years.

I've been at this school ... 2001.
(Ich bin seit 2001 an dieser Schule.)
* ein Zeitpunkt in der Vergangenheit

I've been at this school **since*** 2001.
* since = a point of time in the past

We've worked in this office ... 3 years.
(Wir arbeiten seit 3 Jahren in diesem Büro.)
* Zeitdauer, von jetzt an zurück

We've worked in this office **for*** 3 years.
* for = a period of time

Mrs Chapman has been ill ... 6 months.
(Frau Chapman ist seit 6 Monaten krank.)
* Zeitdauer

Mrs Chapman has been ill **for** 6 months.



Sally has had that dog ... 2002.

Sally has had that dog **since** 2002.

I haven't written to Ted ... a year or more.
(Ich habe nicht geschrieben zu Ted seit einem Jahr oder mehr.)

I haven't written to Ted **for** a year or more.

We bought Jane a T-shirt.
We also bought ...
Amanda.
(Wir kauften Jane eine T-shirt.
Wir kauften auch **eins für**
Amanda.)

We bought Jane
a T-shirt. We also
bought **one for**
Amanda.

Victoria told us her secret.
She told ...
too.
(Victoria verrät uns ihr
Geheimnis. Sie erzählte **es**
auch ihrer Schwester.)

Victoria told us her
secret. She told **it to**
her sister, too.

Give your brother this
letter. And give this ...

(Gib deinem Bruder diesen
Brief. Und gib diesen **an**
deine Eltern.)

this **one to your**
parents.

* Verlaufsform des **present**
perfect (benutzt)

How long **have**
you **been using***
a computer?
* = present perfect
progressive

We each other
e-mails for years.
(Wir **schicken*** uns seit
Jahren **schon** gegenseitig
E-Mails.)
* Verlaufsform des **present**
perfect benutzen!

We **have been**
sending each other
e-mails for years.

How long ... you
there?
(Wie lange **stehst du da**
schon?)

How long **have** you
been standing
there?

Philip strangely
lately.
(Philip **be** **merkwürdig**...)
