(Ich war müde.)

I **was** tired.

Tom and Ethel ... at the zoo.  
(Tom und Ethel waren im Zoo.)

Tom and Ethel **were** at the zoo.

It ... my coat.  
(Es war nicht mein Mantel.)

It **wasn't** my coat.

... Tom with you?  
(War Tom nicht bei dir?)

**Wasn't** Tom with you?

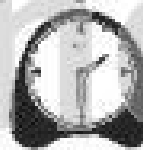


Liz and Ellen ... on the bus.  
(Liz und Ellen waren nicht im Bus.)

Liz and Ellen **weren't** on the bus.

The game ... at 2.30 pm.  
(Das Spiel fing um 14.30 an.)

The game **started** at 2.30 pm.



Ted and his friends ... in the garden.  
(Ted und seine Freunde spielten im Garten.)

Ted and his friends **played** in the garden.

Who ... you with your homework?  
(Wer half dir mit deinen Hausaufgaben.)

Who **helped** you with your homework?

Mary ... tennis with the others.  
(Mary spielte nicht mit den anderen Tennis.)

Mary **didn't play** tennis with the others.

I ... hungry, so I ... a big meal.  
(Ich war nicht hungrig, also wollte ich keine große Mahlzeit.)

I **wasn't** hungry, so I **didn't want** a big meal.



Who ... you ...?  
(Wem hast du geholfen?)  
= mit simple past übersetzen.

Who **did** you **help**?

Who ... you and who ... you ...?  
(Wer hat dich gesehen und wen hast du gesehen?)  
= mit simple past übersetzen.

Who **saw** you and who **did** you **see**?

... you ... to Ted's party?  
- No, I ...  
(Bist du zu Teds Party gegangen? - Nein.)  
= mit simple past übersetzen.

**Did** you **go** to Ted's party? - No, I **didn't**.

We ... a taxi and ... home.  
(Wir nahmen ein Taxi und fuhren nach Hause.)

We **took** a taxi and **went** home.

You ... be late!  
(Du darfst nicht zu spät kommen.)

You **mustn't** be late!

You ... get up early tomorrow.  
(Du brauchst nicht früh aufstehen.)

You **needn't** get up early tomorrow.

Everyone but me has got a present. Where's ...?

(Jeder außer mir hat ein Geschenk. Wo ist **meins**?)

Everyone but me has got a present. Where's **mine**?



My hair is longer than ...  
(Meine Haare sind länger als **deine**.)

My hair is longer than **yours**.

These aren't Mary's trainers. ... are red and white.

(Das sind nicht Marys Sportschuhe. **Ihre** sind rot und weiß.)

These aren't Mary's trainers. **Hers** are red and white.

The dog ... go out.  
(Der Hund **will** rausgehen.)



The dog **wants to** go out.

I ... clean my shoes.  
I ... clean my shoes.  
(Ich **musste** meine Schuhe putzen.)



I **must** clean my shoes.  
I **have to** clean my shoes.

Yesterday I ... help in the garden.  
(Gestern **musste** ich im Garten helfen.)

Yesterday I **had to** help in the garden.



... you ... dance with the girls?  
(**Musstest** du mit den Mädchen tanzen?)

Did you **have to** dance with the girls?

... you ... hold the spider?  
(**Musstest** du die Spinne halten?)



Did you **have to** hold the spider?

We ... wait long.  
(Wir **mussten** nicht lange warten.)

We **didn't have to** wait long.

I need ... money.  
(Ich **brauche** etwas Geld.)



I need **some** money.

I met ... interesting people.  
(Ich lernte **einige** interessante Menschen kennen.)

I met **some** interesting people.

There's no bread. We must buy ...  
(Es gibt kein Brot. Wir müssen **welches** kaufen.)

There's no bread. We must buy **some**.

They haven't got ... money.  
(Sie haben **kein** Geld.)

They haven't got **any** money.

I can't see ... birds.  
(Ich kann **keine** Vögel sehen.)



I can't see **any** birds.

Did you take ... interesting photos?

Did you take **any** interesting photos?

Can you give me a CD?  
- Sorry I haven't got ...

(Kannst du mir eine CD geben? - Ich habe keine.)

Can you give me a CD?
